
Landscape Intensive

July 16-20, 9:30AM-12:30PM

Students will focus on the basics of landscape painting with an emphasis on composition, shapes, and color and will work both on-site and in the studio. Clay Days! Creating Movement Through Textured Form July 16-27, 1-4PM

Instructor: Danielle Catté Tuition: \$325 (Members \$310)

This workshop will explore both functional and sculptural works by throwing on the wheel, slab building and coil building. We will take a closer look into form, texture, underglaze painting, slips and stains, glazes and cold finish surface treatments. All techniques will be demonstrated. Students are encouraged to explore personal concepts. Follow-through direction will be provided to each student on a one-on-one basis. Previous clay experience is not required.



Animal/Pet Portraits

July 23-27, 1-4PM

Instructor: Jeanine Leclaire Tuition: \$160 (Members \$150)*

Jeanine Leclaire will provide materials and instruction for students to create two animal portraits. The first will be a collage which will provide knowledge of skills on which the students will build for the second portrait—an acrylic painting. For the first portrait the students will choose from a variety of animal photographs provided. For the second portrait the students may bring in a

5" x 7" photograph of their pet, an animal that is not their pet, or choose from the available photographs of animals provided. The skills learned in this class will include (but are not limited to) how to use value, how to choose good compositions, how to paint fur, and how to use transfer methods to start painting faster.

*Additional materials fee of \$50 to be paid to the instructor. Students will receive: 4 paint brushes, a 5" x 7" painting surface, high-quality professional paint, tools to transfer images, and more!



Drawing to See

In order to draw well, students need to learn to "see"—edges, relationships, light and shadow. negative spaces and shapes. These skills will be honed through warm-up rituals and observation drawing. Gesture Drawing will be practiced to see holistically and draw expressively. Critical thinking and generating creative

ideas will be developed in group discussions and individual collections Students will experiment with assorted drawing media and tools including: graphite, conté, charcoal, ink, pens and brushes. Materials list will be sent upon enrollment.

Scratching the Surface: Drypoint Printmaking June 25-29, 1-4PM

Instructor: Nicole Patrice Dul Tuition: \$160 (Members \$150)

Love to draw? This class may be for you! Drypoint is a form of intaglio printmaking, which does not use any acid. You will use drypoint tools to directly incise plexi and copper plates and learn several approaches to this method. Line drypoint, tonal techniques, scraping and burnishing will be covered. When inked and wiped, drypoint plates produce rich velvet toned prints. You will be introduced to the use of various inking practices including: mixing color, transparency, surface roll, a la poupée, and chine collé, You will complete two editions of prints pulled from a press. No prior printmaking experience necessary.

Garden Printmaking

July 2-6, 1-4PM (No class on July 4th.)

Love nature? Excited about art? Learn low-tech non-toxic printmaking techniques while exploring nature. Gather objects in nature and through the use of a wide variety of techniques, transfer the exquisite qualities of those objects into amazing layered artworks. Make monotypes, collagraphs, and rubbings. Use sun printing and organic object pressing to create incredible unique artwork.

Worldly Impressions: Mexican Printmaking

Celebrate the culture of Mexico through its extensive printmaking tradition. From artists like José Guadalupe Posada, Diego Rivera, David Alfaro Siqueiros, Alfredo Zalce, José Clemente Orozco, Rufino Tamavo to Artemio Rodriguez. Mexico has had a distinguished history of important printmakers. You will learn about the rich history of Mexican printed arts from past to present and make amazing drypoint and linocut images of your own. Explore the unique processes of Mexican printmakers inspired by the country's politics. economics, and identity while learning to create relief prints by hand and intaglio prints on an etching press. Use indigenous patterns and ornamentation to inspire your stunning impressions of Mexico.

Gig Art: Music in Screenprinting

Instructor: Nicole Patrice Dul Tuition: \$160 (Members \$150)

Discover the tradition of graphic artwork in music past and present. You will create your own t-shirts, posters and stickers promoting your favorite musicians. Students will explore the art of silkscreen as it pertains to albums and all types of gig art. Explore screenprinting's use in the music culture and learn silkscreen.



Experimental Printmaking

July 16-20, 1:30-4:30PM

Instructor: Nicole Patrice Dul Tuition: \$160 (Members \$150)

Push boundaries and set your art apart with new printmaking skills. In this intensive introduction to printmaking techniques, you will explore linocut, drypoint, monotype, polyester plate litho and collagraph print processes. You will also experiment with combining processes and mixing media to make unique, multiple-color prints. You will learn to utilize printmaking methods in ways that are relevant to your own ideas. Work intuitively or from prior drawings or image references.
