

Summer Camp 2021 Guidelines during the Pandemic

Coming to class: A very strict protocol outdoors and/or inside the Center is required.

- Face masks will be required and regular sanitizing procedures will be carried out. Students/Family members must wear a mask at all times when in and around the Center including walking in from the parking lot. Both the teacher and students are required to wear a mask throughout the class period including during time spent working at their assigned work space.
- Upon arrival, parents/guardians will bring their student to the front picnic tables facing Ashbourne Road. Center staff will greet you and ask you to sign in.
- Please keep your child home if they feel ill and/or are displaying COVID-19 symptoms. Anyone having a temperature above 100.4 degrees and/or, nausea, diarrhea, severe headache in the last 24 hours will be required to return home and notify their healthcare provider.
- If anyone has been in contact with a person diagnosed with coronavirus at any time, they should self-isolate, inform the Center staff AND seek COVID testing.
- If a student is at [higher risk for severe illness per the CDC](#), students/parents/guardians must inform the Center staff of the nature of the risk. Higher risk groups include, but are not limited to, adults over 65, people with moderate to severe asthma, people with cardiovascular conditions, diabetes, people with liver or kidney disease, and immunocompromised individuals.
- Everyone entering the building will be required to wash/sanitize their hands throughout the day.
- Sanitizer will be available outside and inside the building.
- Students should arrive with a full water bottle. Water fountains will not be used.
- Restrooms: Only one person at a time will be allowed to utilize the restroom, and physical distancing will be practiced. Handwashing will be required. Each age group has an assigned bathroom. High touch areas will be sanitized after each bathroom use.

If we should have a case of Covid-19 in staff or students:

Per Montgomery County Office of Public Health guidelines, if individuals were within six feet or less for 15 minutes or more of a person with COVID-19, they should be tested for COVID-19 and quarantined for 10 days. [Please be mindful some COVID-19 variants manifest as allergies \(runny nose, congestion, watery eyes\).](#)
